Anda is an illegal immigrant, dealing with the pain of survivors' guilt post ex-Yugoslavian war by keeping emotionally muted. Feeling misplaced in her new home in Canada, she tries to maintain some degree of cultural continuity with her homeland by conforming to the tight knit Muslim immigrant community. Fearful of rejection and deportation, she holds back from any life experiences. That is until her world collides with Noelle's.

Noelle is an open-minded new-worldly young woman, with an outgoing personality that masks the dark secrets of the past ravaging her soul. While assisting Anda in her emotional and physical awakening, Noelle's wounds start to heal when she realizes there is much to

be learned from Anda's forgiveness, quiet perseverance and sense of duty.

This is a timely story that bridges the gap between immigrant and non-immigrant experiences as it tackles the elements of voyeurism, love triangle, female empowerment and sexual awakening. When they take off the headscarf and makeup and look beyond religion and cultural pretences, Anda and Noelle are just two lost women navigating through the rite of passage to womanhood and self-realization.
